

George Washington	1789-1797	None	Whiskey Rebellion, strengthened federal government, warned against political parties and entangling alliances
John Adams	1797-1801	Federalist	XYZ Affair, Alien and Sedition Acts
Thomas Jefferson	1801-1809	Democratic-Republican	Embargo Act, Louisiana Purchase, Lewis and Clark
James Madison	1809-1817	Democratic Republican	War of 1812
James Monroe	1817-1825	Democratic Republican	Era of Good Feelings
John Quincy Adams	1825-1829	Democratic Republican	created USNO and Smithsonian Institution
Andrew Jackson	1829-1837	Democrat	Indian Removal, won Battle of New Orleans
Martin Van Buren	1837-1841	Democrat	he eventually fixed the Panic of 1837
William Henry Harrison	1841-1841	Whig	idiot who gave a speech in freezing rain without an overcoat and died after being President a month
John Tyler	1841-1845	Whig	known as His Accidency and for vetoing a ton of bills, and also for having his Cabinet quit on him except for Daniel Webster (THIS COMES UP)
James K. Polk	1845-1849	Democrat	finishes annexation of Texas, brings in California, fixes border with Canada
Zachary Taylor	1849-1850	Whig	Old Rough and Ready, hero of Mexican War, dies after going against doctor's orders
Millard Fillmore	1850-1853	Whig	California becomes a state, Compromise of 1850, last Whig president
Franklin Pierce	1853-1857	Democrat	Bleeding Kansas, Kansas-Nebraska Act
James Buchanan	1857-1861	Democrat	possibly homosexual, definitely useless as a President. He was absolutely the worst and did nothing to solve the crisis before the Civil War.
Abraham Lincoln	1861-1865	Republican	US Civil War, freed slaves w/ Emancipation Proclamation, Gettysburg Address
Andrew Johnson	1865-1869	Democrat	Reconstruction
Ulysses S. Grant	1869-1877	Republican	Whiskey Ring corruption ran rampant in his administration. This was not his fault, however. He was just incompetent as President, and much better as a general.
Rutherford B. Hayes	1877-1881	Republican	Bought the presidency by promising to remove Federal troops from the South; allegedly defeated Samuel Tilden in election of 1876.
James Garfield	1881-1881	Republican	assassinated by Charles Guiteau
Chester A. Arthur	1881-1885	Republican	Pendleton Civil Service Act (jobs based on merit), actually vetoed the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882
Grover Cleveland	1885-1889	Democrat	only President to serve non-consecutive terms, vetoed more bills than anyone except FDR
Benjamin Harrison	1889-1893	Republican	McKinley Tariff, Sherman Silver Act, Sherman Anti-trust Act
Grover Cleveland	1893-1897	Democrat	only President to serve non-consecutive terms, vetoed more bills than anyone except FDR
William McKinley	1897-1901	Republican	raised tariffs to protect American industry, Spanish-American War, assassinated in 1901 by Leon Czolgosz
Theodore Roosevelt	1901-1909	Republican	active in trust-busting (Standard Oil) and conservation. Ran in 1912 as a Bull Moose Party candidate.
William H. Taft	1909-1913	Republican	The most active trustbuster in history, and also served as Chief Justice afterwards. Also a pretty heavy dude.
Woodrow Wilson	1913-1921	Democrat	Only President to get a doctorate. Kept US out of World War I until Russia left, then we joined (Lusitania and Zimmerman telegram helped too)
Warren G. Harding	1921-1923	Republican	Teapot Dome scandal, died in 1923
Calvin Coolidge	1923-1929	Republican	Silent Cal, famous for not saying much. Put down Boston police strike as Governor
Herbert Hoover	1929-1933	Republican	Quaker, believed in limited government, and tried to solve Great Depression. His ideas worked to a small degree. Final nail in the coffin was Bonus Army.
FDR	1933-1945	Democrat	New Deal, alphabet soup, court-packing, WWII
Harry S. Truman	1945-1953	Democrat	Potsdam Conference, began Cold War with USSR, and had policy of containment w/ communism
Dwight Eisenhower	1953-1961	Republican	built Interstate System all over the United States, "military-industrial complex"
JFK	1961-1963	Democrat	"New Frontier", space race, shot in Dallas by someone on a grassy knoll
LBJ	1963-1969	Democrat	sent a lot of troops to Vietnam, VERY unpopular president
Richard Nixon	1969-1974	Republican	Watergate, visit to China (1st ever after it became Communist), lost 1960 presidential election, SALT treaty with USSR, detente beginnings with USSR
Gerald Ford	1974-1977	Republican	only man to become President without getting elected P or VP, pardoned Nixon, pretty unpopular and definitely not charismatic
Jimmy Carter	1977-1981	Democrat	about the same as Ford, and totally botched the Iranian hostage affair
Ronald Reagan	1981-1989	Republican	Great Communicator, established greater detente relations with USSR, greater demilitarization, nominates Sandra Day O'Connor (1st woman) to the Court
George H.W. Bush	1989-1993	Republican	Persian Gulf War, director of CIA, first VP to be elected P since Van Buren, last President to serve in combat.
William Clinton	1993-2001	Democrat	Whitewater Incident, huge crime bill that reverses violent crime, education improves, NAFTA, helped end Bosnian War, Oslo Accords
George W. Bush	2001-2009	Republican	9/11, No Child Left Behind, Patriot Act, goes after Bin Laden, Hurricane Katrina, nominates Alito and Roberts to the Court
Barack Obama	2009-2017	Democrat	nominated Sotomayor and Kagan to the Court, ended 2008 recession, bailing out auto industry and TPP (time will tell about his presidency)
Donald Trump	2017-	Republican	increased jobs, rebuilding military, wants to build wall on Mexican border, traces of corruption everywhere, nominated Brett Kavanaugh to the Court
